As we prepare to go off exploring other museums this weekend, I wanted to give you some quick updates on what is going with the historical society.

We have had some interesting programming already this year. In May, in honor of National Nurses Month, I presented on Julia Wheelock. She is considered Michigan's Florence Nightengale for all she did to help with soldiers, particularly Michigan soldiers, during the Civil War. In June, Linda Ciangi taught us about John Lombard, who was a graduate of Ionia Public Schools and fought with the Flying Tigers during WWII.

Her talk was fascinating, and I am still hearing people praise her lecture. As Linda said, "There are Ionians everywhere!"





50 YEARS AGO — SUMMER 1974

A non-profit corporation was officially formed as "the Ionia County Historical Society", and Lynn Morris was elected the first President. (The previous Grand Valley Sequestors group had been fully absorbed into this new organization.)

Members George and Caroline Vance and Lynn and Ariel Morris signed loan papers to purchase the old Lockwood home on behalf of the new organization.

When the keys to the "John C. Blanchard House" were handed over, the members immediately got to work cleaning the place up. This would prove to be a multi-year task—a never-ending task, as the toll of time never stops being a challenge to an old house no matter how beautiful it might be.

While the crews worked in the house, the administrators of the Historical Society filed papers to add the Blanchard House to the National Register of Historic Places - a designation that would open the door to official recognition of its historical value and grant money.

And that was only the beginning!
